With the recent passage of the \$2 trillion American Rescue Plan, Idaho's K-12 schools are poised to receive more than \$400 million in assistance, far and away the largest of the three COVID-19-related relief acts (CARES Act, CRRSA), which together will inject almost \$700 million into schools across the state. The latest round of funds should be distributed to LEAs within 60 days of receipt by the state, in direct proportion to Title I funding allocations.

#### ESSER, ESSER II & ARP ESSER

#### **IDAHO FUNDING NOTES**

In April 2021, The Idaho State Board of Education today approved a plan to distribute nearly \$12 million in ESSER SEA reserve funds (from the CRRSA Act approved by Congress in late 2020) to over 90 school districts and charter schools who receive little or no Title I federal funding based on their percentage of low-income students.

 The Board also approved a motion of preliminarily designated 2.5 percent of the third round, the ARP ESSER SEA reserve fund for schools that receive no, or a low amount of ESSER funds based on their population of low-income students, and that the funds be appropriated for use in FY 20222 with carryover authority in FY 2023.
